If your present medications are related to heart disease, hypertension, or psychiatric conditions, the primary physician (Doctor who prescribed the medications) should decide if the medications can be stopped safely. These include:

1. No alpha-adrenergic such as: Normodyne, Trandate, Hytrin, Prisolone, or Yocon.
2. No beta-adrenergic blockers such as: Blocadren, Cartrol, Tenormin, Corgard, inderal, inderide, Timolide, Kerlone, Levatol, Lopressor, Viskin, Normazide, Propranolol or Sectrol, Toprol, Corzide, and Tenoretic.
3. No MAO (anti-depressants) such as: Mayrlan, Nardil, Parnate, and others such as some tricyclics which include Doxepin, Sinequan, and Elavil, Adapin, Asendin, Pamelor, and Tofranil.
